Wealth-Generating Ecologies

- Paul B. Hartzog provided the inspiration for and was an invited speaker & participant at the 2016 Mutual Aid Network "Community Mapping Summit" in Madison, WI, USA. At the summit Paul worked with organizer Stephanie Rearick, Michel Bauwens, and community leaders to brainstorm ways to organize and interconnect Madison's local and digital resources.

Cooperation & Commons

- Paul was a Researcher and Coordinator on "A New Literacy of Cooperation", an interdisciplinary project created by Howard Rheingold and The Institute for the Future and funded by DARPA. The project resulted in The Cooperation Commons, an online repository of cooperation & commons research (http://cooperationcommons.com) managed and programmed by Paul.
- Paul was a coordinator and lecturer for "Toward a Literacy of Cooperation" (Hum 202) at Stanford University (with Howard Rheingold and IFTF's Andrea Saveri). Paul lectured on "Creating Institutions for Collective Action". Video of the lecture is on Paul's "Academic" YouTube channel listed below).
- Paul was a coordinator and guest of **David Bollier**'s "On The Commons" (http:/onthecommons.org).

The Future of Money

- In 2004, Paul was interviewed by Douglas Rushkoff who subsequently published "Open Source Currency." The interview also resulted in Paul's article "The Future of Money" published by Mindjack. "The Future of Money" was the first article to not only suggest that the future economy would see an explosion of alternative currencies, but also to explain the mechanisms and reasons why.
- Paul was invited to discuss the future of money at "The Sharing Economy: New Opportunities for Citizen-Based Developments" a workshop including the Institute for the Future, Howard Rheingold, and academic participants from Stanford, Berkeley, etc.
- Paul was an Organizer (with Douglas Rushkoff) and an Invited Speaker of the "NextNet" Contact summit in New York City, USA.

The Success of Openness

- Paul's research on "The Success of Openness" included programming a complex systems agent-based simulation for Robert Axelrod at the University of Michigan.
- Paul worked with the Institute for the Future (Kathi Vian and Jerry Michalski) to adapt "The Success of Openness" for ITFT's 2006 Ten-Year Forecast. The piece "Open Scale" demonstrated key dynamics in the future economy using Paul's research and an interview conducted with Clay Shirky.
